"RAZOR 2011" OPERATION ORDER

1. SITUATION.

a. Enemy Forces.

Composition & Strenght: Local guerrilla fighters will cover operation area probably with one platoon. Armed mostly with light assault weapon of different types such are 7,62x39mm (AK-47), 5,45x39mm (AK-74), but also Western types in 5,56mm calibre (M16, M4 and M249). Bolt and semiautomatic snipers also can be expected. Also can expect use of 40mm grenades, hand grenades and antipersonnel mines.

Identification: Guerrilla fighters are dressed in different combination of military uniforms but also civilian clothing. Because of that, they most commonly use for identification red ribbons on arms.

Disposition: In operation area can be expected light guerrilla patrols while most of guerrilla fighters are located deeper in forest, most probably in some hangar.

Current location: unknown

Movement anticipated: Guerrilla patrols if alerted can very fast be supported by main forces located in hangars.

Capabilities: Can expect combination of young and recently enlisted fighters but also older and very experienced fighters. Very familiar with area of operation so Airborne Special Operation Task Force (Air-SOTF) unit can expect fast flanking during fight with them.

Assessment of intentions: Probably guerrilla will strongly defend their territory but if suppressed they will retreat avoiding to have bigger casualties.

b. Friendly Forces.

In operation area there is not known existence of friendly forces. Local government forces do not have control over that area. There is slight possibility of encounter with local civilians such are hunters. Do not open fire on them until fire is oppened.

c. Attachments and Detachments.

1st Special Forces Operation Dev (SFOD) "Delta" reinforced with local government Special Forces will form combined **Air-SOTF** unit. **Air-SOTF** unit will be deployed with 160th Special Operation Aviation Regiment (SOAR) helicopters. Because of forest density helicopters could not give fire support to deployed ground forces. After mission objective is achieved, call them for getaway from operation area.

d. Commander's Evaluation.

This is routine mission for our special forces. Make us proud!

2. MISSION.

United States Special Operations Commander started this operation codenamed "RAZOR 2011" according to Presidental Executive Order No.US-352F. Mission is to prevent our enemies to come in posesion of our top aerospace tehnology.

3. EXECUTION.

Intention: Air-SOTF unit must find guerrilla base and recover lost Air Force device.

a. Concept of Operations.

After helicopter insertion in operation area, form defensive perimeter around heliport and establish field **Air-SOTF** base. Enter forest with recon-unit, find guerrilla base and recover lost Air Force device known as "cinculator kataklingera".

b. Tasks/Missions to Manoeuvre Units.

Air-SOTF unit will be lead by most experienced and outranking officer no mater is it from Delta Force or local government Special Forces unit. This is cooperative NATO operation so high level of integration must be achieved. After "election" of Commanding Officer (CO), his Executive Officer (XO) will be deployed from another special forces unit. Together they will select best soldiers for execution of different part of mission.

c. Tasks/Missions to Combat Support Units.

Among 160th SOAR there is no support units.

d. Coordinating Instructions.

Coordinating instructions between two elements of Airborne Special Operation Task Force unit are already defined in part b.

Planed time for helicopter insertion is at 11:00h of day 20-02-2011. Mission report will be given after mission is finished.

4. ADMINISTRATION/LOGISTICS.

Operation **"RAZOR 2011"** is logistical supported by Special Forces own logistic. Every soldier will be deployed in area with his own long shelf-life ration and drink.

Air-SOTF CO and XO are instructed to find among local civilians reliable personnel for forming field kitchen. So until 16:00h field kitchen will be ready to serve field rations of local food known as "grah sa kobasicama i pancetom" by symbolic price of 2 EUR per ration (or 15 units in local government money).

Every soldier is responsible for his own drink, because local government logistic can not fortfill everybody needs.

Medical support of wounded will be provided in Air-SOTF MASH unit which will be established in Air-SOTF field base. Their respawn time until they arrive in to MASH is 10 minutes.

5. COMMAND AND SIGNAL.

Air-SOTF soldiers will be marked with yellow ribbons on arms.

Secret parole will be provided by CO and XO after mission is started.

Also Air-SOTF CO and XO will select radio-channel for their troops in range from 1st to 4th channel.

Language in use on radio-communication depend also on CO/XO judgement.
